Born: April 27, 1990 (Pekin, Ill.) **Drafted:** 2010 – Ottawa's seventh-round pick (196th overall)

2012-13: Attending his third Senators development camp. **2011-12:** Completed his junior season with the WCHA's University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks establishing new collegiate career-highs in goals (six) and points (20) ... Born: July 12, 1989 (Ottawa) **Drafted:** 2008 – Ottawa's fifth-round pick (139th overall)

2012-13: Attending his fifth Senators development camp. **2011-12:** Completed his first full season of professional hockey with the Binghamton Senators (AHL), tallying 22 points (five goals, 17 assists) and 127 penalty minutes in 73 games ...
