**Born:** April 27, 1990 (Pekin, Ill.) **Drafted:** 2010 – Ottawa's seventh-round pick (196th overall)

**2011-12:** Attending his second Senators development camp. **2010-11:** Made his WCHA debut with the University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks ... Was one of 10 players to appear in each of his team's 39 games ... Ranked second among team defencemen with 19 points ... Registered the first multi-point game of his NCAA career with two assists in a 4-2 win at Michigan on Oct. 22 ... Scored the first goal of his collegiate career in a 5-1 home win over Minnesota State on Nov. 5 ... Notched a season-high +4 ranking on two occasions. **2009-10:** Was one of two players to appear in all 60 games for the Cedar Rapids RoughRiders (USHL), setting new career highs in all statistical categories ... Led USHL defencemen in assists (39) and overall scoring while finishing second in team scoring with 54 points ... **2011-12:** Attending his fifth Senators development camp. **2010-11:** Completed his junior season with the University of North Dakota Fighting Sioux (WCHA), tallying 12 points (two goals, 10 assists) in 44 games ... Appeared in each of the team's games for the second consecutive season, setting a new collegiate career high in assists ... **2011-12:** Attending his fourth Senators development camp. **2010-11:** Completed his junior season with the Clarkson University Golden Knights (ECAC), tallying 11 points (three goals, eight assists) in 31 games and serving as team captain ... Ranked first (tie) among Golden Knights' defencemen in scoring ... Established a new collegiate career high in penalty minutes (55) ... Signed an entry-level contract with the Senators on March 11 before concluding his season with Binghamton (AHL) where he made his professional debut on March 23 vs Syracuse ... **Born:** June 21, 1989 (Toronto) **Drafted:** 2007 – Ottawa's third-round pick (90th overall)

**2011-12:** Attending his fifth Senators development camp. **2010-11:** Completed his collegiate career as an alternate captain with the University of Michigan Wolverines (CCHA) tallying 31 points (11 goals, 20 assists) in 41 games ... Helped the Wolverines reach the NCAA Frozen Four final where they were defeated 3-2 in overtime by Minnesota-Duluth on April 9 in St. Paul, Minn. ... Recorded an assist in a 2-0 win over North Dakota in a Frozen Four national semi-final game on April 7 ...
